Stop at Simpson Reef Wildlife Viewpoint to see and hear seals

Hike down to tide pools in South Cove

Go to beach across from campground and watch sunset

Camp at Sunset Bay State park in Coos Bay, Oregon

# Thursday, September 19 – Oregon Coast Highway to Fort Stevens State Park (254 miles; 6 hours)

Continue driving on Pacific Coast Highway up the Oregon Coast

Stop at Oregon Dunes National Recreation Area Overlook (Mile 200)

Hike 2.3-mile round trip dune trail to ocean and back

Stop at Heceta Lighthouse (Mile 179)

Hike up to lighthouse and keeper's house atop the bluff

Drive to Fort Steven State Park at the mouth of the Columbia River in northern Oregon Desperately try to catch a good sunset

Peter Iredale wreck – crazy hippy guy with dog and RV with Jesus loves you South Jetty observation deck - sunset where the Columbia River flow into the sea

### Friday, September 20 – Fort Stevens to Redmond to Leavenworth (350 miles; 7 hours)

Stop in Astoria to climb the Astoria Column on Coxcomb Hills for views of the Columbia River

Drive to Trader Joes in Bellevue, Washington to meet Tommy after work

Drive to Leavenworth, Washington via I90 and 97

Camp at Pine Village KOA in Leavenworth

### Saturday, September 21 – Leavenworth (27 miles; 1 hour)

Have lattes at campground coffee shop

Drive to Forest Ranger Station in Leavenworth to find a good hike - Colchuk Lake

Drive to trailhead -8.4 miles on Icicle Creek Road, left on Eightmile Road, and then 3.8 miles on washboard dirt road to parking lot

Hike 8.4-mile (RT) to Colchuk Lake – beautiful glacial-blue, alpine lake surrounded by granite mountain faces and glaciers

Cross over to Washington on the Bridge of the Gods

Continue driving along Columbia River on Washington side

Camp at Columbia Hills State Park (used to be called Horsethief Lake State Park)

### Wednesday, September 25 – Columbia River to Sisters, Oregon (166 miles; 4 hours)

Continue driving along Washington 14

Visit the Maryhill Museum of Art

Visit the nearby replica of Stonehenge

Find several geocaches

Cross over Columbia River on 97 and drive to Sisters, Oregon

Drive past to check out Tumalo State park

Go back to Gardens RV Park (used to be a KOA)

Drive to Route 20 scenic viewpoint (a few miles down the road from campground) to photograph sunset over the Sisters

Dinner at The Open Door – grilled salmon

Camp at Garden RV

### Thursday, September 26 – Sisters to Klamath Falls (185 miles; 4 hours)

Wake up to chilly morning – 28 degrees

Hike 3.6-mile (RT) hike to the top of Black Butte

Geocache enroute – veggy theme (Tomatoes, Corn, Kohlrabi, Lettuce, Spinach)

Drive towards Lava Beds National Monument

Stop at scenic viewpoint along Route 20 to photograph Sisters again

Camp in a Walmart in Klamath Falls, Oregon

Food shop

# Friday, September 27 –Klamath Falls to Lava Beds National Monument (84 miles; 2 ½ hours)

Drive to Lava Beds National Monument

Stop at Wildlife Refuge Viewpoint before entering park

Stop in Visitor Center and get White-Nose Bat Disease clearance

Get campsite in Indian Wells Campground in the park

Do 3 cave hikes: Sunshine, Upper to Lower Sentinel, and Skull

Sunshine (along cave loop) – moderately challenging 466 feet long

Upper to Lower Sentinel (along cave loop) -3,280 feet long

Skull (2.4 miles from Visitor Center) – 580 feet long

Drive the entire road through the park (about 15 miles) making stops along the way

Hike1.5-mile (RT) to the top of Schonchin Butte to fire lookout

Talk to ranger about his job as fire lookout Great views of McNulty and Lassen Peak

Short hike to Black Crater

Hike the .5 mile Captain Jack's Stronghold Historic Trail – inner loop

Watch the sun go down over Tule Lake from the East Wildlife Overlook

Have wine and cheese

On way back, stop at Canby Cross and Fleener Chimneys

Camp at Indian Well Campground in the park

# Saturday, September 28 – Lava Beds National Monument to Lassen Volcanic National Park (171 miles; 4 hours)

Drive to Lassen Volcanic National Park

Drive scenic drive to Bumpass Hell

Hike 3.0-mile (RT) Bumpass Hell Trail to bubbling mudpots, hot springs, and fumaroles

Hike around Manzanita Lake and photograph sunset over Lassen Peak

Camp at Manzanita Lake Campground in Lassen NP

### Sunday, September 29 – Lassen, Chico, and Auburn (184 miles; 4 hours)

Decide to leave Lassen a day early because of weather – cold, rainy, and windy

Drive towards Auburn, CA

Stop in Chico and tour the Bidwell Mansion State Historic Park

Continue onto Auburn

Camp at Auburn Gold Country RV Park

Relax by pool and go in hot tub

### Monday, September 30 – Auburn and Nevada City (62 miles; 1½ hours)

Mountain bike the 7.5-mile (RT) Clementine Lake Trail along the North Fork of the

American River from the Old Foresthill Road Bridge to Lake Clementine

Drive to Nevada City (25 miles north on Route 49) to walk around

Hang out at campground pool

Camp at Auburn Gold Country RV Park

### Tuesday, October 1 – Auburn to San Francisco RV Resort (135 miles; 2½ hours)

Drive to San Francisco

Change oil in motorhome

Run 5 miles to pier and bluff

Andrew comes down to meet us after work; Celeste bike rides later

Watch sunset over Pacific Ocean from back of RV

Dinner at local Thai Restaurant

Camp at San Francisco RV Resort – overlooking Pacific Ocean

### Wednesday, October 2 – San Francisco RV Resort (90 miles; 2 ½ hours)

Drive down Coast (Route 1) to Pescadero stopping a various viewpoints

Stop at Pebble Beach in Pescadero

Hang out at Gray Whale Cove State Beach in Montara

Meet Andrew and Celeste at Planet Granite (climbing gym)

Dinner at local Vietnamese Restaurant Camp at San Francisco RV Resort – overlooking Pacific Ocean
